In May, the Haywood County Schools Foundation awarded 93 Pisgah, Tuscola, and Haywood Early College high school seniors with more than 120 scholarships totaling \$400,500. Scholarship amounts ranged from \$500 to \$48,000.

Currently, the Foundation manages more than 60 scholarships. Scholarships may be endowed or funded annually. Criteria for awarding the scholarship are designed by the donors and the Foundation board of directors. Endowed scholarships are generated through the investment of permanently-held principals so that only the income from the principal is used for scholarship awards.

This year, Joseph Clontz from Tuscola High School was awarded the James and Betty Scott Memorial Scholarship. The scholarship is one of the largest the Foundation offers. Clontz is attending the University of North Carolina - Charlotte to study mechanical engineering. He hopes to enter the automotive industry, focusing on engine optimization or aerodynamics.

“Receiving the James and Betty Scott Scholarship means that I get to focus on my schooling rather than the financial aspects of college,” Clontz said. “My family is really happy that I can go to college for what I really want to do.”

Clontz credits his courses from Tuscola with preparing him for college and opening up his eyes to potential careers.

“My computer engineering teacher Justin Rhinehart was great,” Clontz said. “His classes helped me decide that I wanted to enter the engineering field.”



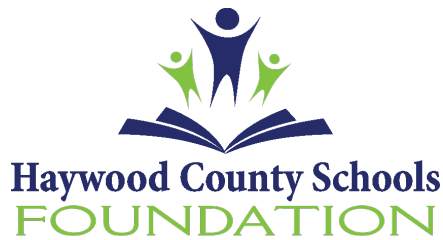

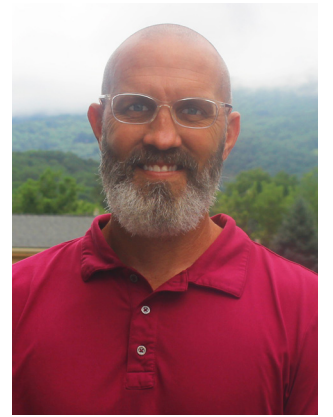

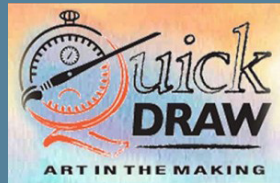

PARTNERSHIPS FOR SUCCESS

Grants fund resources for teachers and staff to enrich the learning experience of our district's students. Last year, we gave 137 grants to Haywood County Schools' employees totaling more than \$51,000.

MITSUBISHI POWER

Mitsubishi Power, a large corporation with offices around the globe, had its annual company meeting in Western North Carolina this summer. Each year, the company chooses one local non-profit to assist in the area where its meeting is held. Representatives from Mitsubishi Power reached out to the Haywood County Schools Foundation about donating school supplies to our students. The group donated supplies to Canton Middle School and Central Haywood High School. "We look forward to helping the local communities where we have meetings," Nestor Riosa, VP of service execution, said. "It's part of our company culture."



CANTON SAWMILL AND COLUMBIA FOREST PRODUCTS

Pisgah High School's wood working program received two large donations of material from Canton Sawmill and Columbia Forest Products of Old Fort. Students will use the materials to construct cabinets. "My woodworking II class has 20 students," shop teacher Ron Cook said. "It would not be possible for me to get the funding for each of them to build a cabinet." Pisgah's wood working classes are part of Haywood County Schools' Career and Technical Education (CTE) program. CTE bridges the gap between students and employers by directly preparing students for high-wage, high-demand careers.

THE MARDI GRAS BALL RAISES SCHOLARSHIP MONEY FOR HAYWOOD COUNTY SCHOOLS STUDENTS. THIS YEAR, THE EVENT RAISED \$166,033 - THE HIGHEST AMOUNT EVER.

The Mardi Gras Ball, sponsored by First Citizens Bank, is Haywood County Schools Foundation's largest fundraiser of the year.

Since 2009, the event has raised more than \$860,000 for the Haywood County Schools Foundation to give to scholarships, grants, and support services.

This year's record-breaking Mardi Gras Ball raised more than \$166,000.

Brent Yarski and Danya Vanhook were crowned king and queen. Yarski works in sales at Ken Wilson Ford, along with owning a landscaping business and farm. Vanhook is a local attorney and owner of Vanhook Law.

Other candidates this year included Waynesville Police officer Tyler Howell, bluegrass musician Darren Nicholson, Legacy Dance Center owner Hayley Justice and transitions counselor Katie Vanderpool.

Together, the candidates raised \$94,000 more than the last Mardi Gras Ball held in 2020.

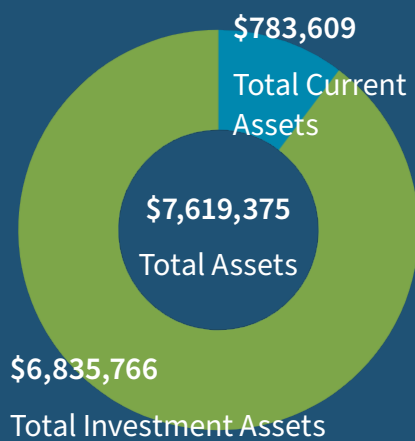

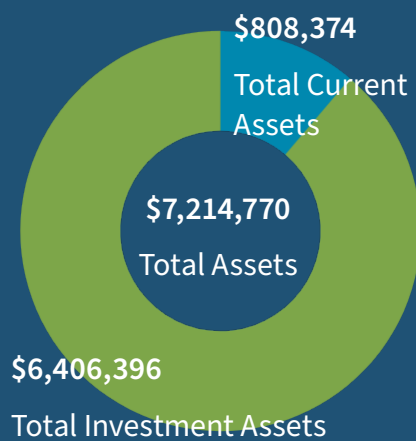

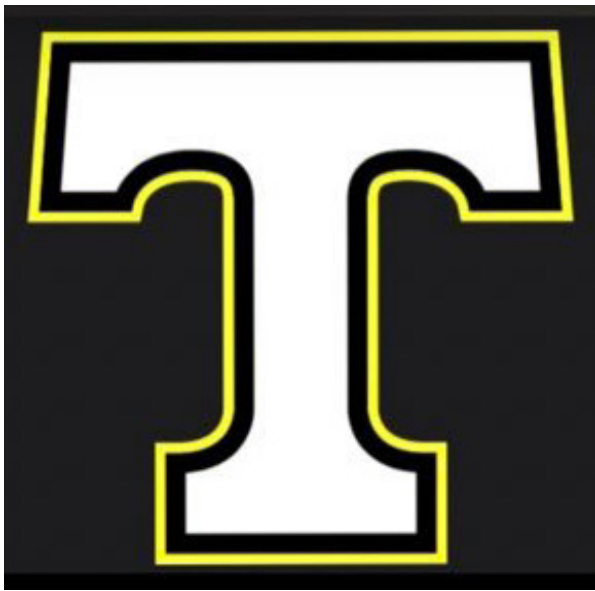

ON TUSCOLA, ON TUSCOLA! TUSCOLA CLASS OF 1973 CREATES LASTING LEGACY

In 2013, alumni from the Tuscola High School class of 1973 decided to leave a legacy by awarding graduating seniors with scholarships. The scholarship is awarded annually to one female and one male high school senior from Tuscola. Rick Webb has been instrumental in collecting funds for this scholarship. To begin, he ran as a Mardi Gras Ball candidate and won in 2016 to ensure the scholarship would be perpetual. Since then, the scholarship has been given to 20 students.

Criteria for the scholarship include: graduating senior from Tuscola, financial need, participation in extracurricular activities, involvement in community service, and scholastic achievement. Preference is given, but not limited to, a child/grandchild of a Tuscola High School class of 1973 graduate.
